

State Authorization Agency Regulation Chart

***** Please note the information in the chart below applies to the State Authorization Agency only. There may be professional licensure boards in some states that require approval of placements, but that information is not reflected in this chart. *****

The information in this chart is current as of April 30, 2024. Thereafter, if a State Authorization Agency contacts NC-SARA with an update, the chart will be revised.

The primary source of information included in the chart is email responses received from State Authorization Agencies as requested by Sarah Levy, NC-SARA's Senior Director, Policy & Regulatory Affairs.

In cases where NC-SARA did not receive an email response from a State Authorization Agency, we used other sources of information for this chart, including state law, responses previously provided by the State Authorization Agency for the [State Authorization Guide](#), and/or the agency's webpage.

The approach taken for this chart is to err on the side of caution. Accordingly, if there is a possibility the answer could be "Yes," the chart will reflect "Yes." As one example, in instances where a state has more than one State Authorization Agency, if any agency is a "Yes," the chart will reflect "Yes."

In addition, this chart is meant to capture "Yes" in column B only if a state regulates exclusively out-of-state distance education (meaning the state regulates an out-of-state institution for merely enrolling a student into a distance education program).

In all cases, institutions should contact the State Authorization Agency directly to confirm the agency's requirements.
